

HYANNIS PORT, Mass. (AP) -Joseph P. Kennedy was joined by his wife in mourning last night the death of their President son, John F. Kennedy, who was laid to rest yesterday at Arlington National Cemetery.

Mrs. Rose Kennedy, mother of the late President, flew home by Air Force jet to join her ailing husband in grieving over the assassination death of their eldest son last Friday.

FBI Gave Police Tip Oswald Would Be Shot

WASHINGTON (AP) - The FBI received and passed along to local law officers in Dallas, Tex., early Sunday an anonymous threat that Lee Harvey Oswald, accused of the assassination of President Kennedy, would be killed, an FBI spokesman said today.

A few hours later Oswald was shot fatally in the basement of the police station as he was being moved to the county jail.

Exchanges Reopen

nounced last night.

President Johnson directed the investigation of all the circumstances surrounding the brutal assassination of President Kennedy and the murder of his alleged assassin."

THE WHITE HOUSE said Johnson has "directed all federal agencies to co-operate, and the people of the nation may be sure that all of the facts will be made public."

Rep. Hale Boggs of Louisiana, assistant Democratic House leader. suggested a high level congressional investigation of Kennedy's assassination be carried out. He said this should be done since the facts cannot be put into the record by a trial of the man accused of firing the fatal shots.


This was supposed to be the day of The Party. The cake with three candles to blow out, the friends singing boisterious "happy birthdays," the gifts.

PROCESSION CROSSES BRIDGE TO ARLINGTON NATIONAL CEMETERY




